



ALL ENTRY FEE MONIES ARE USED TO PROCESS ELDER'S MEAT

* If you have received a successful endorsement/tag (elk) one year, you are not eligible to enter the draw the following year (e.g. Receive a successful tag in 2021, you are not eligible in 2022)*

FOR WEI WAI KUM FIRST NATION ELK HUNT

This endorsement is only for the use of **WEI WAI KUM FIRST NATION** Members only, hunting within their traditional territories. Each permit must have printed on it the designated hunter's name and address. Each permit must be carried at all times by the designated hunter when in the field or by anyone transporting elk carcasses or parts resulting from the hunt.

- Written Authorization
 - While hunting elk under this agreement, the designated hunter will carry the appropriate endorsement as written authorization from the Chief and Council. This will be confirmed through completion of the "ISSUED BY:" and "DATE:" sections of the attached endorsement.
- (2) Cancellation of permit Upon killing an elk, the hunter must immediately sign and date the endorsement and return it to the issuer.
- (3) Hunting Dates: As specified on this endorsement.
- (4) Location, animal class on a Hunt Zone basis as specified on this endorsement (map attached).
- (5) Hunting Methods
 - In accordance with the laws of general application (i.e., safety or private property must not be jeopardized; it is unlawful to use lights while hunting, to use rimfire cartridges, or to shoot from a motor vehicle or a boat propelled by a motor). These, and other regulations pertaining to hunting methods, are further outlined in the Hunting Regulations Synopsis and in the Wildlife Act:

- (6) Landowner permission must be obtained to access private land.
- (7) The elk, once harvested, must not be sold or bartered in whole or in part. Any hunting of wildlife species for sale or barter, in whole or in part, is not legal, except as authorized by regulation or where there is a demonstrated aboriginal or treaty right to do so.
- (8) The permit must not be sold or used in a commercial manner such as in guideoutfitting.
 - **If you do not have a PAL or a certificate to hunt you can designate a band member who is certified.**



As we do this, one of our goals for 2022 is to gain more knowledge and awareness of our Ligwiłdaxw families and to work with community members who are willing to share their stories, photos and memories.

During my time at the Laich-Kwil-Tach Research Centre (LRC) I have gained valuable knowledge of our history. Some of this comes from reading "Life Stories" and the photos that are shared.

We have a collection of photos that have been shared, some of the photos are of family gatherings, community gatherings, doing fish, birthday parties, weddings and so many other family events that make up our rich collection of photos held in the LRC for future generations.

We will record your life story and we will scan the photos you share, making sure that you have a digital copy as well, making it easier for you to share your photos with family. We hope to hear from you and that you will support this work to preserve our collective Ligwiłdaxw history!

I have also spent time filling requests from people in the community who are doing their own research on their family history or on Ligwiłdaxw history. 

Looking After a Legacy: Through the Grains of Cedar

Exhibit celebrates the cultural legacy of Wei Wai Kum's Henderson family Kwakwaka'wakw artists Bill Henderson, Greg Henderson and Junior Henderson of the Wei Wai Kum First Nation in Campbell River will honour the legacy of carver Sam Henderson in an exhibit this fall entitled Looking After a Legacy: Through the Grains of Cedar. This exhibition at Spirits of the West Coast Art Gallery from Sept. 3 to Dec. 31 is rooted in the profound desire by the artists to carry on the legacy of their father and grandfather, Master carver Sam Henderson. Sam lived his life dedicated to the preservation of Kwakwaka'wakw knowledge and culture, and used the practice of carving to preserve these ancient traditions. It is a legacy he has left behind for the



next generation of carvers. The Henderson family to this day is a highly respected family of the Wei Wai Kum First Nation. Bill Henderson, son of Sam Henderson, is a Master carver in the art of "making wood speak." Junior Henderson and Greg Henderson are both grandsons of Sam Henderson and represent the third generation of exceptional potlatch carvers.

Their carvings and totem poles are celebrated throughout the world


and can be seen in Asia, Europe, North America and especially in many communities along our beautiful Northwest Coast. Their masterpieces are highly collectible and are represented in many national and international exhibitions and galleries. When you visit this exhibition, you will see over 20 masterpieces including a wide variety of dramatic masks, stunning frontlets, amazing totem poles, paddles and a beautiful talking staff. This exhibition and sale bring fresh insights into the Henderson's' lifelong commitment to the continuity and diversity of their cultural heritage. In the spirit of Looking After a Legacy: Through the Grains of Cedar, Bill has followed his father's path by sharing the tradition of carving with the next generation, including his nephews Greg and Junior Henderson. Greg and Junior - esteemed carvers in their own rights - join Bill in this exhibition and sale as a showcase of how traditions are passed down and carried forward. Join them on Sept. 3 at 11 a.m. for the opening celebrations. You will see the Henderson family perform and witness the opening of this important exhibition. The artists will be on-site until 3 p.m. Looking After a Legacy: Through the Grains of Cedar, will also be presented in an innovative virtual format including the livestreamed opening celebration on Facebook and Instagram at 11 a.m. on Saturday, Sept. 3. 

Land Guardian Program

Course Description:

NRTG's Land Guardian Program (LGP) is designed to meet the increasing demand for skilled guardians employed within communities, industry, non-profit organizations, or regional stakeholder groups. Graduates of this program can perform guardian roles, including observing, recording, and reporting results, information, and advice to industry stakeholders, government, and regulators. Participants learn practical skills and abilities in four core skill areas:

Safety and Fieldwork Logistics:

Field safety, planning, data collection and management, navigation and orienteering, mensuration and reporting.

Environmental Monitoring:

 Construction site monitoring, spill response, erosion and sediment control, working with legislation, identification, protection and management of sensitive habitats & species.

Identification & Assessment of Environmental Features:

Basic identification of significant fish, wildlife & vegetation species; introduction to species-at-risk, and rangeland, marine, riparian, and sensitive habitats.

Management:

Technical writing, business correspondence, fish & wildlife management, project management and supervision.

Pre-Requisites:

A standard one to two-day First Aid course is recommended, but not mandatory. Participants should be prepared for extensive field training.

Personal Equipment Requirements:

Course participants are required to provide their own personal protective equipment: suitable field clothing (including rain gear), Suunto MC-2 compass, Suunto PM5 Clinometer, Eslon 30m measuring tape, Waterproof Field Book, Bag lunch & refreshments each day, and own transportation.

Course Format:

The Land Guardian Program is delivered over a combined 8 consecutive weeks. The LGP includes online and in-person instruction with 'hands on' training delivered in realistic field conditions.



Natural Resource Administrator:

Campbell River Indian Band (CRIB), also known as Wei Wai Kum, is currently hiring a full-time Natural Resource Administrator to join our Team in Campbell River. The successful applicant will work in a variety of settings to gather and manage complex natural resource data, complete analyses and develop options, to provide advice to Wei Wai Kum Chief and Council and other decision-makers. This will include facilitating and coordinating projects within Wei Wai Kum's expansive territory and supporting the Guardian and Cultural Heritage Programs. The purpose of this role is to aid in the assertion of rights, title, and self-governance for the Nation through a land-based focus that extends beyond Reserve Lands.

Responsibilities:

- Work alongside the Guardians and Cultural Heritage Monitor Programs to aid in their program development, expansion, and implementation.
- Compile and integrate data collected by the Guardians and Cultural Heritage Monitor Programs to inform Chief and Council and support decision-making for the Nation.
- Lead in the territorial land administration and development of resource management policies and procedures for the Nation's imminent Incremental Treaty Settlement Land transfer of approximately 2300 hectares of land including:
 - Develop a Land Management Plan, and
 - o Support the development of a Forestry Stewardship Plan
- Connect consultative referral responses with the Nation's resource management objectives
- Collect and amalgamate research data and plans into a cohesive resource management plan that includes the identification of opportunities for further research and development to advance the Nation's interests.
- Develop an organization chart, job descriptions, training and process manuals for land base stewards.
